Most of the resolutions about Indigenous people passed unanimously. I believe the passing of Resolution C009 was the highlight of this GC for me. Most of our delegation spoke to the resolution. This resolution is for the Navajoland Area Mission to become a Missionary Diocese. Many deputies and bishops gave us congratulations and encouraging words.

There were many meetings between legislative sessions, such as budget hearings/sessions, people of Color, and the Indigenous Caucus. Another memorable moment was catching PB Curry, who greeted me with open arms and willingly signed one of the books I had purchased from the exhibit hall. We had a chance to offer a Tadidin (corn pollen) prayer to the Ohio River nearby.

Lastly, I want to thank the individuals who participated in

the Silent Auction. Navajoland ECW put four items up for auction: a Navajo Rug, a Navajo Wedding Basket, a Turquoise Bracelet, and a necklace. The winners were Fr. Joe Hubbard, SD; Edgar Wallace, KY; Sandra Corp, UT; and Carol Gallagher, MA. Rev. Ann Hallisey matched the total proceeds made. I am beyond grateful for Ann's match, which all returned to ECN's travel account.
